Catherine also has two music CDs out. The first, *Diamond Star*, is the soundtrack for her novel of the same name, performed with the rock band, Point Valid. The second, *Goodbye Note*, includes covers as well as originals. She performs with various musicians at clubs science conventions, and other venues in the US and also overseas, most recently as the Guest of Honor at Context, the New Zealand National Science Fiction Convention.
