FUNCTION SPACE

MarsCon 2000 has eight rooms dedicated to programming. This includes four rooms for regular programming, a ballroom for main stage events, and four poolside cabanas. Programming cabanas will host Krushenko's (a forum for relaxed discussions and readings), Blue Mars (our video & film room), the Martian Music/Filk Room, and a Young Aliens Room (for youth-oriented activities). Schmitt will regale us with tales of UFO investigations, Denise Boie will facilitate a group art project and discuss early forms of art, and Jack Borkowski will host a Cold Terror Fleet Assembly as well as participate in marathon Klingon programming events.






